Temperature Symbols

W : 60-65F nights and 80-90 F days. These plants hate being cold.

I : 58-60 F nights and 75-80F days. The intermediate plants are generally more tolerant of a wider range of temperatures.

C: 55-58 nights and days around 75F. These plants hate being hot.

Hardy: These are plants that we have grown outside in Bolinas all year. The lows here can go occasionally down to 34 F for a day or so . Our outdoor plans are unheated but under cover, protected from frost.
